

The Impact of Utah's Nonprofits

- There are 6094 registered 501c3 organizations in Utah and over 8,800 nonprofit organizations total. 5 out of 10 of the largest public charities in Utah are hospitals or healthcare providers.
- 90% of public charities in Utah generate less than \$500,000 in revenue per year. This means most nonprofits are small.
- Less than 7% of Utah charities reported total revenues of over \$1 million annually, and these public charities bring in 95% of the revenue earned by the sector in the state.
- The total gross revenues reported by all 501(c)3 organizations in Utah was more than \$8 billion in 2014, which represents 6% of Utah's Gross Domestic Product.
- Utah nonprofits employed 67,090 people more than 6.7% of the state's workforce in 2012.
- In Utah 953,990 volunteers dedicated 193.7 million hours of service in 2014, worth an estimated economic contribution of \$4.5 billion.

National Nonprofit Facts

- There are over 1.09 million public charities in the U.S. and 1.4 million tax exempt organizations.
- 75% of public charities reported less than \$500,000 in revenue in 2012.
- Nonprofits provided \$887 billion to the U.S. economy, that's 5.4% of the nation's entire GDP in 2012.
- Nonprofits paid more than \$587.6 billion in wages in 2010,
 9.2% of all wages and salaries in the U.S.

- Nonprofits are partnering with the public and private sectors to fill service gaps and solve our communities' most intractable problems.
