

## The Impact of Utah's Nonprofits

- There are 6,789 registered 501(c)3 organizations in Utah and over 9,686 nonprofit organizations total. 5 out of 10 public charities in Utah operate in the *Human Services* and *Educa*tion subsectors.
- 71% of public charities in Utah generate less than \$500,000 in revenue per year. This means most nonprofits are small.
- The 3 largest charitable organizations in Utah reported almost \$6 billion in gross revenue for 2017. Totaling 65% of the annual revenue earned by the sector in the state.
- As of September 2017, the total gross revenue reported by all 501(c)3 organizations in Utah was \$9.3 billion, which represents 5.8% of Utah's Gross Domestic Product.
- Utah nonprofits employed 63,000 people more than 6.7% of the state's workforce in 2012.
- In Utah 844,023 volunteers dedicated 170.4 million hours of service in 2015, worth an estimated economic contribution of \$3.8 billion.

## **National Nonprofit Facts**

- There are over **1.2 million** public charities in the U.S. and 1.6 million tax exempt organizations.
- 75% of public charities reported less than \$500,000 in revenue in 2012.
- The next year, nonprofits provided \$937.7 billion to the U.S. economy, an equivalent of 5.4% of the nation's entire GDP.
- Nonprofits paid more than \$634 billion in wages in 2013, 9% of all wages and salaries in the U.S.

# Why does it matter?

- Nonprofit employees, volunteers and clients vote. They support nonprofits who are working on causes they care about.
- Nonprofits are partnering with the public and private sectors to fill service gaps and solve our communities' most intractable problems.
- 43.2% of Utah residents volunteered in 2015, ranking Utah 1st among the 50 states for 11 consecutive years.
