
Utah's Nonprofit Sector

Such vibrancy and growth is a tribute to Utah, a state known for its generosity. This report showcases that vibrancy and generosity with the most up to date information on the state of the sector.

NONPROFIT SECTOR CONTINUES IMPRESSIVE GROWTH

As of September 2019, there are 10,395 nonprofits in Utah. Since 2014, the sector has grown by 23.9%. From September 2018 to September 2019, the sector grew by a very strong 3.8%.

NONPROFIT FOOTPRINT AND UTAH'S PHILANTHROPY GROWS

The value of all assets held by Utah's nonprofit sector totaled \$32.45 billion —a \$2.45 billion (8.3%) increase from 2018

The sector earned a combined income totaling \$23.7 billion.

Combined total gross revenue was \$14.9 billion—an \$800 million (5.6%) increase from 2018.


These figures do not include nonprofit organizations that do not file a form 990 or report the value of their assets, total income, and revenue.

Number of Nonprofits by County




MAJORITY OF NONPROFITS CALL THE WASATCH FRONT HOME

Nonprofit organizations are in every county in Utah.


Nonprofits are largely concentrated in Salt Lake, Utah, Davis, and Weber counties - accounting for three-quarters of all nonprofits in the state. Salt Lake County is home to 46.8% of all nonprofits.

The counties with the lowest percentage of nonprofits are Piute, Daggett, Rich, and Beaver - accounting for 0.45% of all nonprofits in the state. Piute County is home to only four organizations.

UTAH'S NONPROFIT SECTOR IS DIVERSE

There are 8,602 501(c)(3) organizations in Utah that make up 82.8% of the sector.

501(c)(6) and 501(c)(4) organizations are the second and third largest categories, respectively. The three largest National Taxonomy of Exempt Entity (NTEE) major groups in Utah (not including those classified "unknown/unclassified") are: "Human Services" (20.1%) "Public, Societal Benefit" (15.2%) and "Education" (10.2%).
